BACKGROUND:

The Government of Uganda through the Ministry of Water and Environment (Executing Agency) in partnership with United Nations Environment Program (Implementing Agency), is executing a project entitled 'Reducing the Climate change vulnerability of local communities in Uganda through Ecosystem Based Adaptation in forest and wetland ecosystems' for a period of 60 months. The project is funded by GEF the Least Developed Countries Fund.

In Uganda, natural ecosystems such as wetlands and forests contribute considerably to people's livelihoods and to the national economy. However, rapid population growth has led to the degradation of Uganda's wetlands and forests as a result of increased demand for firewood, conversion of land for agricultural purposes and the unsustainable harvesting of wetland and forest products. This degradation is of increasing concern as it reduces the ability of these ecosystems to provide valuable ecological and socio-economic services and consequently jeopardizes the livelihoods of dependent local communities. Predicted climate change, including variable rainfall patterns and higher temperatures, will further negatively affect local communities living around wetlands and forests, as well as the ecosystems upon which they depend.

The problem that the proposed project seeks to address is that the vulnerability of local communities in Uganda to climate change is being exacerbated by ongoing degradation of wetlands and forests and an associated reduction in provision of ecosystem services. The preferred solution would see a reduction in the vulnerability to climate change of local communities through the improved and continued provision of ecosystem goods and services from wetland and forest ecosystems. The project will catalyse replication and up-scaling of EbA interventions in wetland and forest ecosystems in Uganda by implementing and demonstrating concrete on-the-ground EbA interventions in four wetland systems - Rwizi-Lake Mburo-Nakivale, Rwambu-Mpanga, Enyau and River Sironko. By implementing the above-mentioned interventions in the four wetland systems, the proposed project will contribute to four of the nine adaptation priorities identified by Uganda's National Adaptation Programme of Action, namely: i) Priority 1 "Community tree growing"; ii) Priority 2 "Land degradation management"; iii) Priority 8 "Indigenous knowledge and natural resources management"; and iv) Priority 9 "Climate change and development planning". The project interventions will also contribute to Uganda's First and Second National Determined Contributions (NDCs), adaptation priorities of: i) reducing vulnerability in agriculture and livestock, forestry, infrastructure (including transport), water, energy, health, and disaster risk management; ii) promoting forest restoration efforts (afforestation and reforestation programmes, including in urban areas); iii) managing wetlands in such a way that floods are prevented and existing resources conserved; (iv) scaling up of Sustainable Land Management (SLM) and Climate Smart Agriculture (CSA) efforts to increase resilience at the grassroots level; and v) expanding small scale water infrastructure.

The objective of the project is to increase the capacity of government and local communities in Uganda to implement EbA in wetland and forest ecosystem to reduce vulnerability to climate change.

The project goal is to reduce the vulnerability of communities living around wetlands and forests to climate change in the four wetland systems of Rwizi Lake Mburo - Nakivale, Rwambu - Mpanga, Enyau and River Sironko.

The project will be implemented through four components :

Component 1 : Capacity development for EbA in Uganda

Component 2 : Climate change resilient ecosystem in Uganda

Component 3 : Climate change resilient communities in Uganda

<u>Component 4 :</u> Knowledge and research on EbA and climate resilient livelihoods

Terms of Employment

The assignment shall be for a period of five years' subject to a probation period of six months.

Job purpose and Scope of Work

The Chief Technical Advisor (CTA) will be responsible for providing high quality technical guidance and advice for the effective implementation of the project and achievement of the planned results. This includes supporting a culture of reliable planning, quality assurance in output delivery, technical reviews of project reports, supervision and technical support of international and national consultants, ensuring a robust Gender and M&E system and providing technical guidance in achieving project objectives, targets and outcomes. Likewise, s/he will also facilitate and promote coordination and collaboration with other actors in the sector both at national and international levels. The CTA will work in consultation with the Project Manager.

Responsibilities

- Provide overall technical and operational guidance and support to the Project Manager to ensure that project objectives are being met and that activities are carried out with high technical standards;
- Provide quality assurance and technical review of project outputs such as inception reports, studies, assessments, training materials, and knowledge products;
- Develop terms of reference for technical consultancies;
