Undertaking 4:

Develop a strategy for at least one water source per village in line with the Presidential Directive by June 2016/17

Intended Outcomes

 The One Water Source Per Village is used as a planning tool for equity in resource allocation and increased safe water coverage at a National Level.

 Strategy to ensure all villages have at least one source

Scheduled Deliverables

- A revised Uganda Water Atlas 2016
- District Water and Sanitation Investment Plans
- Increase in %age access to safe water source in rural and urban areas, and Equity indicator
 - Revised Guidelines for the DWSCG with districts complying with the planning based on "at least one water source per village"

Planned Activities

- Completion of the national water mapping exercise to generate the database of existing water sources and village locations
- Compilation of all the villages without a safe water source in rural and urban areas of the country
 - Policy guidance to the District LGs to construct new water source in villages without sources

Planned Activities

- Development of District Investment Plans
- Updating the Uganda Water Atlas for the Central and District Local Governments
- Training of District Local Governments in updating of the Water Supply Databases
- Monitoring and reporting on increase in safe water coverage by service areas

Key Challenges

- Limited funding to carry on the the Undertaking
- Development of DIPs is a time consuming exercise (Now 116 Districts)
- Mismatch in the data of the Water Supply Atlas 2016 and villages names as in UBOS database not matching
- Training of the DLG staff in collection and analysis of data took a fairly longer time
